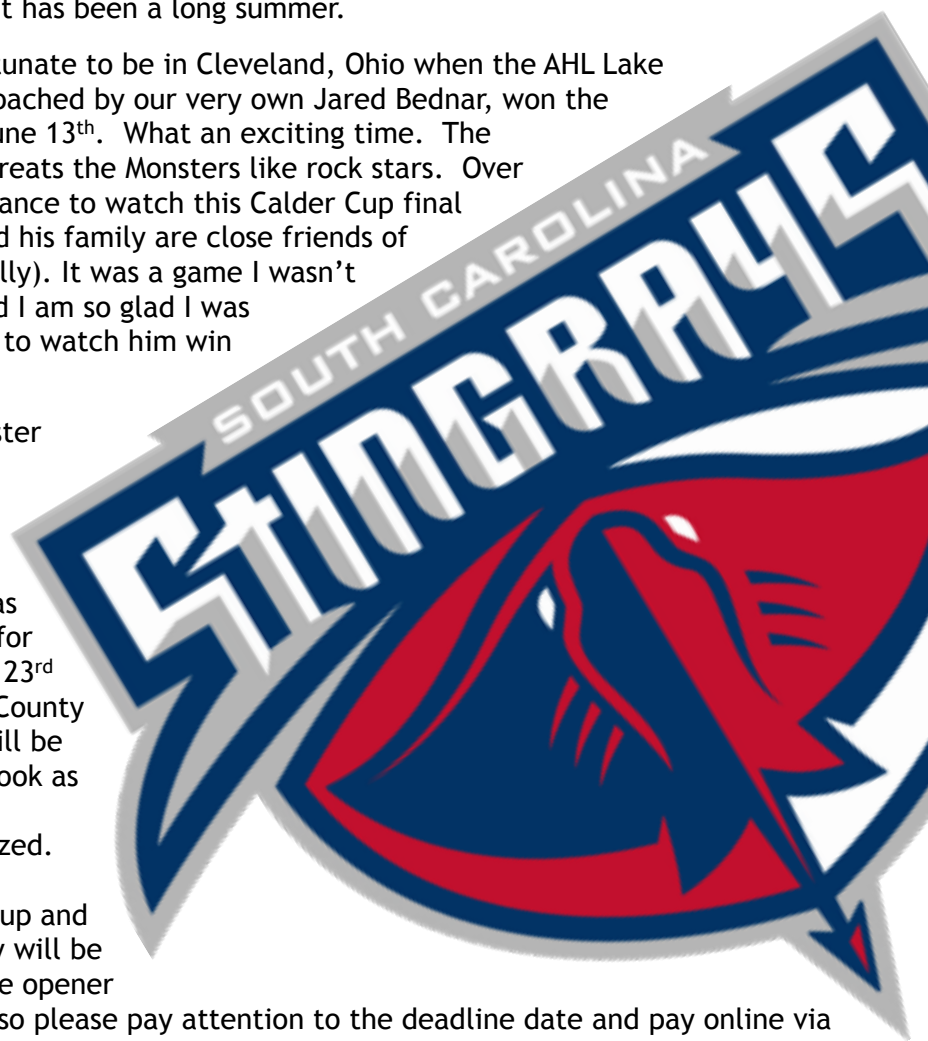

Players really seem to enjoy reliving the memories as they browse through the end product. As always, this is a big project, and I will need as much support from our booster club members as possible.

One way I need support is help putting the scrapbooks together. I have already had some people sign up to be on the committee, which is great. Thank you to those people! Don't worry though, as there is still room and time to sign up. Also, please do not be afraid if you have never scrapbooked. There are plenty of little things to do, such as matting pictures which is easy to learn. Due to feedback that we have gotten in the past, I plan on having regular meetings in North Charleston (date and location TBD) throughout the entire season to help decrease the amount of work done at the end of the season. Do not feel like you need to come to all the meetings to participate. Any and all help will be greatly appreciated!

Another area in which I need help is the donations of scrapbooking materials. I know that you might be thinking that the season has not even started yet, nor have we even begun to make the books. Preseason Stats Monkey

Well, the off season is a barren land of wishing and anticipation for the Stats Monkey. Rosters aren't certain and players signed sometimes don't even make it to training camp and some that do will not be here for opening night. But there is always hope in past stats. Dreams and expectations as well. We've signed some players with consistent history in the ECHL so let's take a look at what, if history repeats itself, what we can expect to see.

Forwards. The big signing of Olivier Archambault was a nice surprise. He has averaged over a point per game in 88 ECHL games. Additionally he doesn't take a lot of penalties which means we don't lose his playmaking ability too often. Joe Devin's return is another shot in the arm to having a big point producing top line. With the Stingrays he has averaged .68 PPG and knows how to score the big goals. Everyone needs to keep an eye on Steven McParland. He played on a VERY talented Providence College team and didn't get many minutes on the top line. His production in juniors and a brief stint with Elmira last year lead me to believe he will be a top line scorer. Patrick Gaul has produced a steady .41 PPG mainly from the 3rd line. His prowess on the penalty kill and energy he brings to the game are hard to measure in stats. Marcus Perrier is slated to move to forward from the blue line much as Scooter Vaughn did a few years ago. He saw a rise in point production last year and look for him to be a mainstay on the 3rd line and special teams. Trevor Gillies is back and although not a force on the scoresheet, his ability to impact the flow of the game and keep things honest on the ice is something this team loves and respects about his game.

The Defense will be interesting to watch this year at camp. Some good players aren't going to make this team. Returnees Wade Epp and Colton Saucerman will be joined by Danny Federico, who won the Kelly Cup with Allen last year and Steve Weinstein who played in Cincy last year. Federico isn't flashy but is a stay at home guy who doesn't take penalties. (Think Luka Vidmar) Weinstein is a bit more offensive and is allergic to the penalty box apparently. He's taken 1



minor penalty in 61 pro games between the AHL and ECHL. He finished last year +1 so it doesn't sound like he plays soft. 2 Rookies, Alex Pompeo and Evan Moore, will be fighting for jobs as well. Moore is a stay at home guy and Pompeo is more offensively minded. Who gets a job at the end of camp may come down to who we get from Hershey and what role is needed more to round out the team.

Oh yeah, Hershey. So what will we get from our affiliation this year? Hard to tell now because free agent invitees to the Washington and Hershey camps will boost these numbers and injuries will take them away. However we can base a few things off of who is currently signed. Our goalies will most likely be Parker Milner and Adam Carlson. We may see Vitek a little if Milner has a great camp and they want to give him some looks. On the forward front it looks like we will get 2. All signed guys are solid. Who we get is hard to even guess. Two names to watch are Tim McGauley and Domenic Monardo as possible Stingrays. D-men are a bit more iffy with Orlov still not signed by the Caps. We should expect 2 assuming everyone stays healthy. Joey Leach, Colby Williams and Hubert Labrie will be fighting for the 7th spot in Hershey.
